1 Summary

Observations were made during groundworks for a conservatory to the west side of 22 Tumulus Close, Gosbecks, Colchester, Essex. Nothing of archaeological significance was found.

2 Introduction

- 2.1 This is the report on an archaeological watching brief carried out by the Colchester Archaeological Trust (CAT) on the 6th February 2002 at 22 Tumulus Way, on behalf of Colchester Borough Council. The work was necessitated by the construction of a conservatory to the west side of the property. Planning permission was given with the condition that an archaeological watching brief be carried out.
- 2.2 This property is located on the modern housing estate at Gosbecks, to the southwest of Colchester town centre. It is centred on National Grid Reference TL 9685 2280.
- 2.3 This report follows the standards set out in the Borough Council's Guidelines on standards and practices for archaeological fieldwork in the Borough of Colchester (1999) and Guidelines on the preparation and transfer of archaeological archives to Colchester Museums (1996), and the IFA's Standard and guidance for an archaeological watching brief (1999).

3 Archaeological background

- 3.1 The site is at Gosbecks, situated within an area of national archaeological importance. This was the centre of the pre-Roman tribal capital of Camulodunum and residence of the leader Cunobelin. It later became an important Roman site, and a Romano-Celtic temple and Roman theatre were built here.
- 3.2 The actual development area lies to the north of the main settlement and religious focus of Camulodunum (now Gosbecks Archaeological Park). Excavations were carried out by CAT in this area in 1995 and 1996 in advance of the housing development (Benfield 2001, report awaiting publication). Cropmarks were excavated to reveal late Iron Age and Roman field boundaries, droveways, enclosure ditches and pits indicating occupation. Of particular interest was a long length of Roman water-main running to the south-west of the new houses. Nearer to the development site was a group of 1st- to 2nd-century cremations, a number of inhumations dating to the 3rd and 4th centuries, and a cremation in a small ditched enclosure (the Colchester archaeologist magazine 1999, pp 18-19.)

4 Aims and objectives

The aim of the watching brief was to identify and record any archaeological features, finds or deposits revealed by the groundworks.

5 Methods

- **5.1** The trenches were machine-dug by the building contractors.
- 5.2 The fieldwork was carried out by Stephen Benfield, a professional archaeologist from CAT, who made one visit to the site after the foundations had been dug on the 6th February 2002. The size of the area excavated was 3.5m by 4.5m. Foundations were excavated to a width of 400mm and a depth of 400mm.




Fig 1 Site location in relation to surrounding archaeological remains (grey tone: built-up areas; dark tone: quarried areas).

- **5.3** A record of the position of the site excavations was made. Soil types were noted and a section drawing was made of the layers (Fig 1).

6 Results

The foundations were dug through 250mm of loamy garden topsoil overlying a dirty gravel which had been disturbed by construction work in the past and which contained brick, plastic and lumps of topsoil.

7 Discussion

The watching brief produced negative results. Within the excavated area there was no evidence of any archaeological finds, features or activity. However, this may be due to the shallow depth of the foundations.

8 Archive deposition




Fig 2 Plan of foundations and section drawing of foundations.
